The session considers how to produce clear writing, with an emphasis on concision and coherence.

How many times have you produced an original insight, only to be told that your writing interfered with conveying your ideas? All good writing requires conceptual clarity. But good writing also demands strong sentences and paragraphs. This workshop runs students through the basics of good writing with a focus on concision and coherence. Topics include writing shorter sentences, eliminating "clutter," crafting topic sentences and employing transition terms.
